The overcoming of geographical distances has always been a main problem of economic or, more generally, of social interaction. Technological progress enabled humans, goods and information to overcome distances ever faster, particularly in the last two centuries. This improved mobility questioned traditional structures and left behind not only winners but also losers. Therefore, mobility has to be understood as both a geographical (horizontal) and a social (vertical) phenomenon. Both aspects are especially salient in migration movements, which are often a result, but sometimes also a cause for social disturbances.

The Gesellschaft für Sozial- und Wirtschaftsgeschichte (Society for Social and Economic History) and the Wirtschaftshistorische Ausschuss of the Verein für Socialpolitik (Economic History Committee of the German Economic Association) jointly host their third congress on economic and social history held in Regensburg. The congress will include contributions addressing the main theme "mobility and migration in historical perspective" as well as a sections filled with contributions on topics going beyond the main theme. In all, 65 presentations will be held distributed over 21 sections. Congress languages are German and English.
